A message from Rev'd Sue Astbury

On the first Sunday in May I took a 10.00 Service in Bishop before driving to Ashcombe for 11.15. What a wonderful drive up past the cemetery with the magnificent views of the river, across the moor looking over Dartmoor and then down into Ashcombe! The sun was shining through the trees with their lush new green growth. But the greatest treat of all a buzzard soaring on the thermals.

This reminded me of the words from Isaiah 40: *those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.*

That is God's desire for each of us that we metaphorically soar like eagles, know the fullness of life. Yet how often we get tied up, bogged down, in the 'stuff' of everyday life. Yes, of course, we all have our responsibilities and commitments to those around us and that is just as it should be. But I have found these words of Henri Nouwen have really helped me to keep things in perspective, perhaps even more so during the past year when life has been far from 'normal' and I offer them to you.

You are not what you do, although you do a lot. You are not what you have collected in terms of friendships and connections, although you might have many. You are not the popularity that you have received. You are not the success of your work. You are not what people say about you, whether they speak well or whether they speak poorly about you. All these things that keep you quite busy, quite occupied, and often quite preoccupied are not telling the truth about who you are. I am here to remind you in the name of God that you are the Beloved Daughters and Sons of God, and that God says to you, "I have called you from all eternity and you are engraved for all eternity in the palms of my hands. You are mine. You belong to me, and I love you with an everlasting love."

Libraries Unlimited announces the roadmap for reintroducing in-person library services, based on the 4-step plan set out by the government. The government has warned that they are subject to change as the plan will be guided by data rather than dates, so please check with your local library before travelling. *(contact details for Chudleigh Library can be found on page 2)*

Throughout the pandemic our focus has been keeping customers, staff and volunteers safe and this will be our continued focus over the coming months.

Library services currently available at your local library are:

- Book browsing.
- Free access to computers, please contact the library.
- Our mobile libraries are back on the road offering book browsing for one bubble at a time.
- Home Library Service in Devon will be offered where the volunteer is comfortable providing this service.
- Meeting Rooms are available for small bookings following the rule of 6.

Here is the latest on borrowing changes coming into effect over the summer:

- Loans from 7th June will revert to standard loan periods (3 weeks books, 1 week DVDs)
- You can borrow up to 24 books and from 1st July 2021 numbers of loans will change to 20 books.
- Reservation charges will recommence on 1st July 2021. Account limit reverts to £5 from 1st July 2021.

Our library services are COVID secure and contactless. The government's messaging has moved from 'Stay at Home' to 'Stay Local'. We encourage you to minimise your travel and use your local library at this time.

Please continue to follow social distancing rules, wear a face covering in public places (including our libraries), and wash your hands regularly.

Volunteers who work with FCN all have farming connections and pastoral concern towards farming people.

2020 has been a difficult year because of Covid-19. Referrals from the national helpline (FCN Tel 03000 111 999), other Agencies and personal recommendations have been followed up by phone. Support for Devon Young Farmers Clubs highlighting mental health issues is continuing.
