A Message from Fr. Albert Lawes

They say that there are two things that you can be certain about: death and taxes. Whatever the certainty of these. the truth is there is certainly more than two things you can be certain about. What immediately springs to mind, (especially as autumn takes hold and I immediately miss the warm weather) is that we can most certainly be assured of change. Our world, our lives, even ourselves are constantly changing and there is no way to stop it. Some things change for the better, some for the worse, but change itself is certain.



Part of humanity's genius is our ability to adapt to change. We interact with this constantly changing world either to do our best to influence that change for something better or do our best to prevent a change for the worse, to conserve what we consider to be good. Maybe that's in our looks, our health, our wealth, or our status? Maybe it's in our society, our communities, or our families? For Christians, it should be in ourselves, our way of life, and our relationship with God.

And there we come to the most certain thing: God. The Psalmist sings to God,

'Of old You laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of Your hands. They will perish, but You endure; they will all wear out like a garment. You change them like clothing, and they pass away; but You are the same, and Your years have no end. The children of Your servants shall dwell secure; their posterity shall be established before You.' (Psalm 102:25-28)

For whilst everything else is changing, God does not change, and therefore rather than be tossed about by all the ups and downs of this changing world, in God we have complete security. How wonderful this is! For the problem with this constant change of which we are part, is that we change even our ideas of what is good. One day it might be this, the next day it might be that. How are we to know if we are changing for the better? Or how are we to know what we need to conserve? In God we have that answer, for He reveals it to us by entering Himself into our changing world. In Jesus Christ we have the unchangeable God become a changeable man, yet remaining that same unchangeable God. 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever.' (Hebrews 13:8). For this reason, He is 'the Way, the Truth, and the Life' (John 14:6), our certain guide through life's certain changes.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall on Thursday 10th July 2025 at 7.30pm

Item(a) Discussion and Decisions (b) The chair opened the meeting. Apologies were received from Cllrs Gardiner, Bellamy, and Gearon. The minutes of the last meeting held on Thursday 12th June 2025 were agreed by everyone and signed by the chair. There were no declarations of interest Public participation. A concern was raised about a hazardous gully on one of the bends in the road between Luton and the golf course. Several vehicles had been damaged. While this was in Bishopteignton Council's area, it was agreed that the Clerk would report this to the Highway's

Officer as the road was used frequently by Ideford parishioners. A

05/07/25 REPORTS:

05.01 County Councillor: No report

05.02 District Councillor Peart: The reopening of Sibelcofor clay extraction, with a public consultation scheduled for 22 July 2025 at Newton Abbot Racecourse. Discussion included mitigation of dust issues, wildlife conservation and preservation, and a proposed off-road path adjacent to Broadway Road.

separate concern from a parishioner about lorries being too large for the Higher Sandygate road was noted: enforcement, signage issues and actions by the company receiving these lorry deliveries was discussed.

05.03 Neighbourhood Beat Manager PCSO Bunce: Zero crimes reported. Cllr. Fox provided regional policing updates: 41 arrests across Devon and Cornwall, a significant amount of drugs were seized in a recent operation.

06/07/25 PARISH MATTERS:

06.01 updates on roadworks, highways, parking issues and potholes: Olchard Lane road markings have been completed. A pothole under Ideford arch (A380) remains a concern; difficulty in reporting this due to the position and location. Silt build-up at the pound in Ideford: urgent action will be required before heavy rain. Clerk to continue chasing highways for resolution.

06.02 Sustainable Ideford - The wildlife warden provided an update. They participated in the Devon Bat Survey, confirming 12 local species. And moth trapping identified 40+ species. Discussion are ongoing about creation of a parish wildlife database; options were debated between open public input and a moderated model to ensure data quality.
