

"Now the Green Blade Riseth from the buried grain" is one of my favourite Easter Hymns. It doesn't shy away from the hard realities of life: " Love Whom we had slain" but it speaks of Christian hope and new beginnings being an integral part of living: "Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green."

These last two years have been the most difficult in living memory for us collectively, only the Second World War could give such reflections of community suffering. My parents lived, as children, through the blitz in London and last year at the Remembrance service in Teignmouth, Rev Jaimie gave reminders of Teignmouth's difficult war experience. As we were starting to pick ourselves up as a nation from the worst of the Pandemic, a European country, Ukraine has been subjected to the terrors of an occupying force with homes and communities bombed to rubble. The comfortable certainties of modern lives have been severely challenged.

As a nation we have been privileged and even grown a little entitled. Sadness, grief and financial worries though are not a stranger to many of us; more have suffered bereavement and health worries in a time of national strain. Mental health is one of the first things to be affected as our usual coping mechanisms are restricted or removed, too much change also brings heightened anxiety. Fortunately there is greater awareness of these issues today. Vivian Greene, (no relation) a motivational speaker, writes: "Life isn't about waiting for the storm to pass. It's about learning how to dance in the rain." I like the positivity of this phrase;

let alone dance you might just want the shelter of an umbrella for a while! I find great comfort and a framework for resilient living in the rhythms of church life. Following Jesus sufferings in Good Friday devotions helps me draw strength and feel less lonely and Jesus ability to sympathise and think of others as he hung on the cross gives me inspiration to think beyond myself. Then as I leave the Good Friday service without a blessing it reminds me of my own shortcomings before God and the need to love him better.

but when it's raining "cats and dogs" and you can't put one foot in front of the other

Easter Day, on the other hand, is about joy, sheer unadulterated joy. This Jesus who human beings killed in violence out of jealousy and anger the man who only brought love and goodness to others has risen. He has overcome the worst that the world can give and shown that love will win. This happens not according to our will, but in a way that brings great blessing; for under his power, grief will turn to joy and death to life.

When our hearts are saddened, grieving or in pain, By Your touch You call us back to life again: Fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been: Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green.

1. The Wildlife survey was completed & results published in the Parish Magazine. We would like to thank all those residents who completed & updated us with their wildlife stories.

² Jubilee Tree is due to be delivered 18 Feb. When finalised we will discuss with the M Green if there is space for planting. If not, it can be planted at Higher Colleybrook.

3 Grant for wildlife projects of £250 has been received & thanks go to Ron Peart & Teignmouth Council for support.

4. "Buzz " the village buzzard has died, RIP. He had been seen these last 8 weeks in the M Green and the Old Rectory, sad to note this.

007/22 PLANNING

007.1 The following planning applications were discussed:

21/02908/FUL - The Sanctuary, Higher Colleybrook

Retention of use of annexe as tourist attraction It was noted that the original application 19/02077/FUL – construction of

dwelling, was yet to be decided. Cllrs had no issue in principle to this application and were in favour of supporting local tourism, but the original applications (17/01849/FUL and 18/00687/FUL) stated that the dwelling be used as a single dwelling only and no part shall be let, leased or sold as a separate unit of

accommodation. If this is still the case, then this application breaches that planning condition.

It was noted that 'no' had been answered to Point 8 on the Planning Application form (new or altered vehicular access), which the PC thought incorrect. Also, the separate entrance formed is not shown on the map submitted with the application.

Clerk to get clarification on these issues.

21/02926/FUL – The Sanctuary, Higher Colleybrook

Retention of various outbuildings (part retrospective) on land at The Sanctuary

It was noted that a total of sixteen buildings were included in this application.

There was confusion over the inclusion of an old agricultural building showing on the plans for this application, as planning permission has already been granted for a new agricultural building to replace this one. The applicant thought that this old building had been included in error and will ask for it to be removed and a new map submitted.

Cllr A Carter-Woodwark was concerned that the site was becoming overdeveloped and the impact this would have on the landscape.

Cllr M Batting raised concerns about the proposed battery shed, which did not give details about any containment of hazardous substances.

Cllrs were unable to make an informed decision on this application until a new map was submitted and clarification on the proposed battery shed were received.

007.2 The following planning decisions were noted: 21/02558/TPO – Towns End, Fore Street Fell five diseased ash trees in Area 1 Grant of consent

Cont. District Councillor Beryl Austen:

I was unable to attend District Council meetings because of a rather severe cold during the last three weeks. Negative results for the virus. However, have returned now to my committee duties.

If you are a resident of Teignbridge, are over 16 and are without sufficient finances to meet short term needs you can apply for the Household Support Fund and get help to do so from the Citizens advice Bureau.

Work has now stopped on Ford House by Midas and we await to be updated on how, and if, progress on remodelling the existing heating and ventilation system as planned will be progressed due to the firm going into administration.

Kingsteignton Town Council succeeded in donating 200 tree whips to residents on Saturday free of charge with planting aids. All were collected and taken for planting long before the intended extended time arranged at The Fountain. This is to encourage the planting of trees in the climate change initiative and is available, on application, to towns and villages. Work has started to install Charge points in Barton Car Park, Eastcliffe Car Park, Forde House Car Park and Newfoundland Car Park which will be active in six to eight weeks.

Councillors have been working on the Budget for the coming year which in view of the difficulties of the past two years will show a slight increase,

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING 002/22 It was proposed by Cllr A Carter-Woodwark, seconded by Cllr M Batting & agreed by all who were present at the meeting, to accept the minutes of the meeting of Thursday 9th December 2021 as a true & accurate record. 003/22 DECLARATION OF INTERESTS None 004/22 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION Thanks was given to those members of the PC who dealt with the problems caused by the day long closure of Longthorn Road. Implications for the village hall if a ban on pavement parking is introduced will be brought up at the next PACT meeting. It was noted that the current resident of Higher Colleybrook did not install a dropped kerb, as was originally assumed by the PC. 005/22 **REPORTS County Councillor Ron Peart:** Citizens Advice Teignbridge update report. With the lifting of plan B restrictions, the staff are being asked to work from home if they can. This means that, if the staff wish to return to working in the office they can do so. This means they can now return to seeing the more vulnerable clients by appointment face to face in the interview room 1 in Newton Abbot office and can push forward with plans for as virtual drop in at Dawlish. Citizens Advice have been discussing the lease for the Newton Abbot office with Teignbridge District Council and are close to finalising a 5 year lease. This will mean they can move forward with plans to replace the heating system and ventilation system, which will mean they can make full use of all Interview rooms and plan the re-opening of the drop in service and make better use of the former CVS room. The work should be completed in the next two months. The Covid -secure guidance that was in operation prior to the introduction of Plan B arrangements will have some minor amendments. They will be able to increase the number of people allowed in the office at anyone time to 25 this is mainly to accommodate the rare occasions when the numbers may reach over 20 when training of new volunteers takes place.

Some of our residents may not be aware that Ideford has a defibrillator.

It is located in the porch of Ideford Village Hall, Church Road, TQ13 0BA

Defibrillator

The locked yellow cabinet can be opened by a member of the public with an access code given by the emergency services via a 999 call.

In rural areas it is very difficult for ambulances to meet the Government targets set for reaching life threatening situations, and access to emergency first aid techniques, including defibrillators can make the difference between life and death.

Statistics show that early defibrillation can increase the survival chances of a person who has suffered a cardiac arrest by as much as 50%.

Land wanted

Slug Pellet Amnesty!

The sale or use of slug pellets based on metaldehyde is illegal as from 31 March. The government has banned them because of the harm they do to hedgehogs, song thrushes, slow worms, frogs and toads (all of which eat slugs) and wildlife generally.

If you have stocks of these pellets in your shed, you need to dispose of them safely - don't be tempted to use them up on your veg patch. The Wildlife Wardens are offering an amnesty: we will collect any pellets you have and take them to the recycling centre, which will accept any household pesticide, so long as the quantity is not more than 5 litres.

Collection days will be <u>**19** and **30** April.</u> <u>Ring or email Robin or Dom (</u>contact details on page 18) to arrange a time. We are also willing to take any other garden chemicals that you may want to get rid of. Please ensure that containers are closed and, in the case of liquids, leak-proof.

Some alternative slug pellets are still legal. Ferric phosphate is less harmful to wildlife but can poison pets. A better approach is to make your garden friendly to the slug and snail predators mentioned above (our wildlife survey showed that there are plenty around). "Hedgehog highways", ponds and bits of old carpet laid on the ground to attract slow-worms will all help. You can introduce nematodes (microscopic organisms that prey on slugs) in dry form. If you still have too many of the blighters, you can reduce losses of vegetable crops by raising the small plants indoors and only planting them out when they are big enough to withstand some damage.

NO MOW MAY or is it ?

You may have heard the phrase "No Mow May". The ultimate concept is not really to stop mowing in May specifically, or to leave whole swathes of your lawn unmown. Behind the catchy title is a simple concept: get people to change their habits so that they mow less – ideally once a month – and leave a patch or two of grass to grow long all year. Gardens can really make a difference to the number of wildflowers in this country.

We can ALL do something within our gardens to help increase the wildflowers that in turn help our insect population, that in turn help the birds, and so on. So as you reach into your shed for the lawn mower this year, have a think about your contribution.

"Small changes" make a difference if we are all playing our part.
