Thoughts of Revd Peter Burren

Sometimes it feels like everything keeps on changing, doesn't it? I was recently walking around a local supermarket, and they were in the middle of a large scale rearranging, so my shop took twice as long as it usually did. I was previously guite content to go off to the shop with my list, and go to the various parts of the shop to get what I needed, and get out again as quickly as possible. But now, I can't even find the milk, bread, or even cat food for my poor cat! So, it can be really frustrating, but it can also be a source of great comfort and contentedness.

As I write this, I am looking out of my kitchen window over the stunningly beautiful view of Teignmouth as the sun is just beginning to put some colour into the previous night's sky. As the mornings' rays reveal the beauty that is the Teign Valley, I am reminded of the soul searching my family and I took in making the decision to move to Teignmouth. When we first arrived, getting up at this time, I looked out at the view and it was all black, still night. However, as the months and seasons have slowly moved on, the days are getting lighter earlier. I don't know about you, but this always makes me feel better about life in general. There is nothing wrong with Winter, it's an essential part of the cycle of the seasons, but when Spring emerges from the dark of Winter, it gives us the promise of the better days to come. And they always do.

When changes happen, it's in our nature to be suspicious, and we very often instinctively react against it, but those changes, although initially difficult, can be the source of such joy. My family and I moved to Teignmouth so that my wife and I could take up our positions as curates for the parish. To do so took a step of faith into the uncertainty of the unknown. We took that step, that decision, by putting our faith in God's hands. Even though things may seem difficult at the start of any period of change, there is one thing that we can rely on throughout it all. God is the one constant in all of creation. He is unchanging in the love he has for us all. It will always be there, even if it all seems dark. All we have to do is seek out his light.

Moving On

We have both hugely appreciated all that has brought us 'life' as part of the Haldon Mission Community over the last 4 years. However, it has become apparent to both of us that Jane needs to re-frame the future of her ministry as continuing to work as a full time stipendiary priest is no longer possible. The need to evolve has been a personal one and into that context of exploring other avenues, Jane has been appointed to the post of part-time Associate Minister in the Totnes Team Ministry, based in Marldon. We are already well known in the Totnes Team, where Jane served her initial curacy following her ordination in 2015. She will be licensed there on 12 June by the Bishop of Plymouth.

We feel it is the best 'next step' for us both individually and together. The Diocese is already working with Revd Carol Green, the Team Rector to support the ministry here in a number of ways until a new appointment is made.

Our decision to move on is a completely personal one. Our last Sunday will be 30 April and there will be a Team Farewell Service at St Michael's, Teignmouth in the evening – details to be announced.

It would seem, on reflection, that God sent us to where we have been since June 2019. Sent rather than called, as Jane sensed very strongly at the time. Sent for the expected and the unexpected – notably supporting six (now eight) churches through pandemic lockdowns and a year-long absence of a Team Rector. That was a time of great challenge but also great things – new ways of being church, new ways of encountering God.

We have pleased and we have disappointed. We have gained and we have lost. And now God is calling us on. Another place – a familiar one at that. Another chapter in the ongoing story. Another way to encounter the truth of what St Benedict said: 'Always we begin again.'

Our prayers will continue to be with you.



A grant scheme is available for hedge improvement and if relevant to residents the wardens will advertise this in the P News.

Cllr R Peart agreed to grant fund the purchase of a trail camera for use by residents.

Fairtrade is a system of certification that aims to ensure a set of standards are met in the production and supply of a product or ingredient. For farmers and workers, Fairtrade means workers' rights, safer working conditions and fairer pay. For shoppers it means high quality, ethically produced products.



Choosing Fairtrade means standing with farmers for fairness and equality, against some of the biggest challenges the world faces. It means farmers creating change, from investing in climate friendly farming techniques to developing women in leadership.

With Fairtrade you change the world a little bit every day. Through simple shopping choices you are showing businesses and governments that you believe in fair and just trade.

How fair trade helps:- an example

Climate change is making some of our favourite foods – like coffee, bananas and chocolate – harder and harder to grow. Combined with deeply unfair trade, communities growing these crops are being pushed to the brink. But through Fairtrade, farmers are finding ways to stand together.

Liliane and Mauro da Silva are a coffee-growing, daughter-raising, future-focused team. As husband and wife they farm land in Brazil's Sul de Minas region. However, farming costs are going up, coffee prices are increasingly volatile and the effects of the climate crisis are deepening. Fellow coffee farmers in other parts of Brazil have recently suffered from unusually heavy frosts, and Liliane and Mauro have noticed that the weather is getting increasingly unpredictable.

She and her colleagues in the Fairtrade co-operative are trying out different methods for protecting their harvests. As well as financial support from Fairtrade, they also receive expertise and information about what's been successful for coffee farmers elsewhere. They also have a long-term trading relationship with a UK coffee buyer, which they value greatly. As Liliane puts it: We are not in charge of the climate, but we can collaborate a lot with it.'

If you're interested in gardening for wildlife, there's a very good on-line event on 6 April at 7.30 pm, organised by Moor Meadows.

Adrian Thomas, author of the RSPB guide to wildlife gardening, will give a practical talk on how to create and look after a wildflower area, plus how to attract more wildlife to your garden. There will be an opportunity to put questions to him.

The Wildlife Wardens

<u>Feeding wild birds</u> was discussed briefly by our Parish Council and as Wildlife Wardens in our village we felt this article would be of interest:

Tuppence a bag? What are we feeding the birds? – Well, whatever it is will certainly be costing more than tuppence a bag, but if you do put food out for the birds, what is its quality and is it being washed down with a generous dose of mycotoxins (moulds), trichomonosis (a disease caused by a protozoan parasite that particularly affects finches), or possibly bird flu?

I gain a huge amount of pleasure from feeding the birds and consider it some compensation for the loss of natural habitat due to the dominance of human activity. However I worry about creating dependency, distorting the balance of species that would naturally occur, and putting birds at risk of disease.

The British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) reports studies of the impact of feeding our wild birds showing that, on average, food from bird feeders makes up less than 20% of a blue tit's diet, though this increases at times of severe weather, and that birds exclusively feed their young on naturally foraged food. So dependency does not appear to be a major concern. Disease is however. The decline of green finches and chaffinches (chaffinches by 25% in the last five years) is understood to be caused by transmission of trichomonosis at bird feeders. Mycotoxin moulds, often already in bird foods when bought, accumulate especially in damp weather, affecting bird health. And this year avian flu, which has been having such a devastating effect on our sea bird colonies, shows the risk where birds gather together. The BTO makes the following recommendations:

- Clean feeders regularly with soapy water (e.g. weekly)
- Keep bird baths clean and provide fresh drinking water daily
- Rotate the position of feeders to avoid the build up of food waste and clean beneath them
- Stop feeding if you think infection is occurring.
