

Rev'd Jane writes:

At the heart of Christmas' is the Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas 2021. It's an invitation to everyone to discover – or rediscover – the good news of God's love as revealed in the birth of Jesus. It also provides an opportunity for each of us to ponder in our hearts – as Mary did – what the extraordinary events of the first Christmas might mean for us now and in the years ahead.

In her poem 'Love Came Down at Christmas', the Pre-Raphaelite poet, Christina Rossetti writes:

Love came down at Christmas,
Love all lovely, love divine;
love was born at Christmas
star and angels gave the sign.

Love is a word which works hard isn't it? There used to be an advert which summed love up as giving someone your last Rolo. You might remember it & it only had any impact if you really enjoyed Rolos! With Christmas in mind, people also talk glibly of loving mince pies don't they? Or carols? I wonder what your favourite is?

Some welcome a break from routine; embrace the party season with open arms; or create space for rare family time. Others love choosing that special present and thrive on list-writing or taking time to catch up with friends, not least through Christmas card enclosures. But this is not the kind or order of love we are reminded of as we see again the baby laid in its manger. However fragile it appears in this episode of God's unfinished story, this love will never let us go. It is unyielding in its constancy; immovable, eternally hopeful: it will not give up.


I leave each one of us with an end of year invitation - to cherish and relish the annual reminder Christmas heralds: we are still the beloved in Christ.

Rosetti's poem finishes:

Love shall be our token,
love be yours and love be mine;
love to God and neighbour,
love for prayer and gift and sign.

Whatever 2022 brings, known & unknown, that's a precious thought to hold against the heart.

096.3 Planning Enforcement:

An update had been received regarding Higher Colleybrook:
A new entrance, dropped kerb and the Airbnb have been noted.

Update from Cllr A Carter-Woodwork (read by the Chairman):
I commented on the fact that we had seen no revised plans for the site - TDC replied that the plans being used were correct, drainage issues were being corrected and there was a front entrance already marked on the plans.

I said there were now two separate entrances, one main and one to the Airbnb business. TDC are not concerned about these but has contacted the owner to advise them that planning permission is required for the Airbnb use, if it is a separate use of accommodation.

The case officer is Gary Crawford, and he can be contacted to discuss concerns, including windows added without permission and the extension of the road running around the site.

DCC Highways have confirmed that:

Higher Colleybrook does not form part of the public highway so the property owner would not need to approach us for permission to install a dropped kerb. There may be restrictions or covenants on their deeds regarding it but I'm afraid as it's private land it's not something that we would be involved in. Gary Crawford will be conducting a site visit to check on the possible planning breach.

Cllr H Bellamy informed all that an update on all enforcement issues affecting Ideford is expected.

097/21 CONCERNS RAISED BY PARISHIONERS TO COUNCILLORS

97.1 Cllr J Gardner informed us of the Sustainable Bishop scheme running in Bishopsteignton; and residents and Cllrs appeared keen for a similar scheme in Ideford. D Morby added that he would be attending a course with the group and will suggest that they contact Ideford.

Church Floodlight

The PCC is aware that the floodlight that usually lights up the church externally has broken. After careful consideration, the PCC have decided not to get this mended. They have decided this for environmental reasons. While it makes the church look nice at night, it is not essential and the PCC considered it a waste of electricity, something that we all need to be aware of in the context of the climate crisis. With this in mind, we thought we'd share some helpful guidance and information regarding outdoor lights;

- The definition of light pollution is 'lights that shine where not needed'
- 60% of the world's insects and animals come out at night and outdoor lights create a false dawn, confusing birds, insects and animals
- Reducing light pollution saves energy, saves money and helps with the climate issues
- Any lights above 0-10% of the horizon cause light pollution
- If you have to have permanent outdoor lights, don't have upwards facing lights, face them downwards
- The stars are beautiful and the more lights we have, the less we can see them
- There is no evidence that turning lights off in rural areas increase crime rates

Perhaps we can all consider our own permanent outdoor/security lights. Are they truly necessary? Do they need to be on all night? Do they disturb neighbours? Can they be less bright/use a lower wattage? We all need to make changes in order to protect the planet and small changes like this can make a big difference if we all action them.

Of course, with Christmas coming up, we'll all enjoy having our festive light displays and thankfully, many lights these days are LED so they use far less electric and most people turn these off at night too, so they don't impact as negatively as some permanent outdoor lights, especially if they're left on all night.

095/21 PARISH MATTERS

095.1 As of Monday 18th evening / Tuesday 19th October, it is believed that the northbound slip road for Ideford may be opened. The Ideford bus stop may be operational at this time. All traffic may be travelling on the north bound carriageway. The southbound Ideford dip junction may however be closed at this time and may not re-open until Monday 15th November (weather dependant). The Olchard turning may also be closed, as traffic will not be able to cross the carriageway. Both the B3192 and B3195 will continue to be open throughout. Cllr R Peart has informed DCC Highways of the disruption caused to Ideford residents over the closure of the A380.

095.2 The 2022 meeting dates were noted and agreed.

095.3 It was decided that if Cllrs were unable to attend meetings, but had questions or items that they needed raising, then the Chair would speak on their behalf and report back to them.

095.4 It was agreed that the PC would investigate further the taking part in planting a tree for The Queen's Green Canopy initiative and a piece will be put in the Parish News requesting suggestions on species and location.

095.5 Wildlife Wardens update:

Wildlife survey Work on the questionnaire is in hand. The aim is to distribute it with the December Parish Magazine.

Levelling up via Biodiversity (NALC meeting) booked to attend and feed back will follow next month.

Metalddehyde slug pellets Use is banned from March next year.

Consideration to be given to a scheme for gardeners to hand in old stock.

Wild about Teignbridge, Zoom meeting attended representing the Parish Council. Presentation will be cascaded to PC & they are encouraged to watch as it highlights local success. This covers "connecting to nature, Carbon reductions, Wildlife warden scheme, Nature on our doorstep, Best Practice website for helping Community Action Plans.

WW have approached Millennium Green & Village Hall for help to progress Ideford Wildlife Displays.

Further Zoom & events planned & booked for ongoing WW knowledge.

096/21 PLANNING

096.1 The following planning applications were considered:

21/02113/FUL – Larcombe Farm, Ideford

Erection of new agricultural building for use as a TB isolation unit. It was proposed by Cllr H Bellamy, seconded by Cllr D Fox and agreed by all to support this application. It was noted that the applicant stated that should the agricultural building not be used as a TB isolation unit, it would be used as a storage building for hay/straw.

Members of the Council have been directed not to attend the Council Offices except when attending meetings in order to maintain security of health for staff. Also, to wear masks until seated. There has been discussion from some of the 47 councillors about having visual meetings extended due to the highest level of cases last week in Teignbridge, Exeter and East Devon. Teignbridge landlords are being offered free training to help them fully understand the complex business of letting property. Contact Teignbridge for a place.

October 1st is the day from which dogs can now be exercised on beaches in the district. The dog regulations regarding other matters are currently being reviewed.

Due to safety concerns traffic lights are being installed at Newbridge in Chudleigh Knighton starting on Sunday 10th October to be completed by 6th November. Diversions will be in place.

There has been some reaction to the decision to give staff an extra day's leave as a thank you for work added to their tasks because of Covid at an estimated cost of £50k.

The Chairman of the Council has been writing letters of thanks to people in the district who have given help to others during the difficult period of the pandemic.

Teignbridge District Council's tree officer does not carry out routine maintenance inspections on trees, for this the owner should employ a suitably qualified professional. One can be found through the Arboricultural Association or the International Society of Arboriculture and there are links to these organisations on our website: [Trees - Teignbridge District Council](#)

Trees are the responsibility of the owner of the land where they are growing. If you do not know who owns the land you should contact the Land Registry: <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/land-registry>

If the tree is on the pavement or verge it is likely to be under the control of Devon County Council Highways Dept. who may be contacted on 0345 1551004 or via their website at:

To establish whether the tree is protected by a tree preservation order or conservation area, please use the 'Protected tree checker' via this link: <https://www.teignbridge.gov.uk/planning/forms/protected-tree-checker>

- Scroll down to see the information
Click on 'Associated Documents' to see the full order.

Commercial properties do not always appear on the address list but if you enter a nearby postcode, you can then zoom and pan on the map to find the building that you want.

Avian Influenza Prevention Zone (AIPZ)

Heart of the South West Trading Standards Service have advised that as of 5pm on the 3 November 2021 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared across Great Britain. This means that all bird keepers in Great Britain (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard are required by law to take a range of bio-security precautions.

To assist all bird keepers in complying with the new rules, the biosecurity guidance and self-assessment checklists have been updated and all the latest information can be found at
