During last month's Jubilee celebrations, the Queen quoted some words from Winston Churchill: 'The farther back you can look, the farther forward you are likely to see.' While I think I can see what the great orator was trying to get at, I am also minded to disagree.

The problem is that we can find ourselves looking back much more than we look forward.

We might tend to think of 'the good old days' or use such phrases as 'in my day' or be constantly reminded about how 'the last vicar did it'! Yes, there are many aspects of the past which were good and, arguably, better than the current days, but if we are constantly looking backwards we will never see where we are going.

Later this year, my debut novel is being published. A story of loss and love, it speaks of hope over adversity and that moving on in life is always possible. Indeed, it's called *Looking to Move On*.

And in many respects, that's what we can all be doing both as individuals and within our churches. What can we be doing to take those 'Next Steps' as the Church of England in Devon is encouraging us to do? How can we grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy? They don't have to be big steps – but we do need to be 'walking'.

For in order to look forwards, we are not to look back or simply keep things as they are. We are to look to God, Lord of the past, present and future, to inspire, encourage and strengthen us. The Lord, not the past, is to be the foundation of all we do.

The psalmist summed this up very succinctly: 'Unless the Lord builds the house, we will labour in vain.' (Psalm 127:1)

May that be true for each one of us.

### I did No Mow May - now what?

Did you leave your lawn unmown in May? Or have you designated part of it as a wild area? If so, you may be wondering what to do now. You may have cut some of your lawn short again, but suppose you want to keep an area for wild flowers and whatever creatures they will attract. Should you leave it alone and let it "rewild"?

The answer is "Yes, but not for ever." If some flowers like speedwell, knapweed or bugle have appeared, you don't want to cut them down. But if you leave a wild area uncut year after year, it will become dominated by tall grasses, or docks, nettles and eventually brambles. The thing to do is to wait until around August, then start mowing regularly (you may need to use a scythe or shears for the first cut) and – very important – **remove all cut material**. This helps to reduce the fertility of the soil, so that delicate wildflowers can compete with grasses and fleshy plants like dock. Don't be tempted to "feed" the patch with any sort of fertiliser – this will do the exact opposite of what you want.

Keep mowing regularly through the autumn, and even in winter if the grass is still growing. Stop mowing in late March and sit back and enjoy your wild patch until August comes round again. Make this your annual routine and you will be

delighted with the wildflowers that appear from nowhere.

If your experiment with No Mow has not produced any flowers, and your patch is a mess of long grass and nettles, give one of us a call. The Wildlife Wardens are here to help!

Devon Wildlife Trust have a **wildlife gardening award**. Households can receive a sign to stick on their gate if they can prove that they are doing certain things to help wildlife in their gardens. Households also receive a book with ideas on wildlife gardening.
