Teignbridge is working with partners across Devon as part of 'Clean Devon', to tackle the issue of littering and fly tipping, and ensure those responsible are caught and penalised. Incidences of fly tipping are on the increase and the council is targeting 'hotspots' where rogue contractors are dumping waste collected from residents, rather than disposing of it responsibly.

Councillor Alistair Dewhirst, Teignbridge District Council's lead member for waste and recycling said: "Many people don't know that they are responsible for disposing of their waste – even if they pay a company to get rid of it on their behalf. So the onus is on the householder to check that the company they're paying to

get rid of their rubbish is disposing of it legally – if not, it could be a lot more expensive than they anticipated as they could be liable for a heavy fine."

The council is also asking people to keep their eye out for illegally dumped rubbish and report it on their website, where it will be investigated and those responsible will be tracked down.

Go for the flow - testing not guesswork

(Taken from Devon County Council's weekly update - 'connect**me'** -June 18th)

A new Devon County Council campaign is encouraging all adults to take twice-weekly rapid lateral flow tests to keep themselves, and others around them, as safe as possible. Lateral flow device tests are for people who do not show any symptoms of having coronavirus. They're an essential part of stopping the spread of coronavirus, because one in three people with COVID-19 don't show any symptoms of having it, and they could be spreading the virus to others unknowingly.

The rapid lateral flow device test kits are widely available to collect from pharmacies and testing sites across Devon and can also be ordered online to be delivered to your door. And if you need help doing a test, you can visit one of our community testing sites too.
