A message from Sharon Hurlow

I wonder how many of you have recently completed the Big Garden Birdwatch?

At my manse in Teignmouth I am blessed to have a garden that backs onto the nature reserve at Coombe Valley. I sat in my dining room on a beautiful bright morning watching the feeders that I have on my balcony and identifying, counting the birds that came to visit. Over the course of one hour, I was amazed at the number of different species I logged; I counted about 38 birds of 11 different species.

There is real beauty in the diversity; each species having their own distinct markings of course but if you watch you notice that they have their own personalities too.

There were blue tits so tiny you wonder how they can ever cope with the winds and the weather that they face but they seem to be so bold. There was the goldfinch, descending on me in gangs of six or seven at a time bringing with them quirky antics along with their bright red masked faces. Then the rarer and very colourful bullfinch, cautious and shy but loyal and true; always in pairs, a mister and a missus together. The solitary, songful robin came too and there were of course the sparrows – aren't we told that God sees the sparrows too?

I think about those feeders. They are hanging there in plain sight, able to feed and nourish but not every bird will be brave enough to come to be fed. But over time many have realised that I, who they perhaps thought meant them harm, only want to help and protect them. Some will now come by way of diving in from a nearby tree, grab a bite and then quickly fly for cover. Some will sit, quietly and contentedly on the feeder perch; they will sit a while and eat their fill.

God wants to feed and nourish us just as He feeds the sparrow, but do we come? Or at least, do we come often enough? Do we sit a while, content in His presence, allowing Him to provide for all our needs. Watching this activity through my window brings me such joy. It lifts my spirits and even though I'm on my own, brings a broad smile to my face.

And I think of God watching over us, knowing each one of us, identifying and naming us, counting our days and noticing everything about us. I think about how God, the master Creator, made us beautiful in our diversity; how we each must bring something unique to His garden and how He created us to bring Him, and each other, such joy.

Zephaniah says: For the Lord your God is living among you. He is a mighty Saviour. He will take delight in you with gladness. With his love, he will calm all your fears. He will rejoice over you with joyful songs.

How often do we think about the fact that we make God smile?



Why is this important?

Illegal off road riding and driving causes real damage to the landscape, heritage sites, and can harm livestock. The use of



What do you need to do?

Under the Road Traffic Act, using a mechanically propelled vehicle without lawful authority on common land, moorland, on any footpath or bridleway is an offence. Ensure you have permission to carry out the activity.

How can you prevent this?

- Be aware of where you are riding and ensure you have permission. Your vehicle could be seized.
- Drive responsibly, anticipate hazards, ensure your vehicle is road worthy.
- Landowners can consider securing entrances and the use of appropriate signage.
- Notify the police using 999 if you suspect an offence is being committed.
- If you have any information about off road riding or driving please email: 101@dc.police.uk, call the non-emergency number, 101 or call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.
- Join Devon & Cornwall Alert, Watch schemes and local social media groups so that you can find out what is happening in your area.

We should be paid back monetarily by the Home Office, but staff are becoming increasingly stretched by the lack of resources.

Cllr R Peart said that he would pass on the PC's concerns over the amount of water leaks that have occurred in the area over the last year and a half.

District Councillor Beryl Austen:

Teignbridge have launched a five-year homelessness and rough sleeping strategy which builds on their past experience in this work and which they have undertaken with some success to help people get and keep a roof over their heads. A four-week consultation is now underway seeking views on how to prevent and relieve homelessness and rough sleeping. The Household Support Fund is still operating and may be able to help pay energy bills and heat in homes for those unable to meet increasing costs. Teignbridge has apologised for the disruption to some waste and recycling rounds and the last weekend has been used to catch up with as many collections as possible. Leave bins out if they are not collected at the expected date as they may be delayed for only a day or so. Plans for the next section of the Teign Estuary Trail have now been approved by County and work will soon commence to establish this longawaited access along the River Teign to Teignmouth. This much wished for trail has been pursued over many years with some persistence and it will be a valuable tourist facility and could well equal the success of other such trails in Devon and Cornwall.




PACT MEETING (Police and Communities Together Meeting)

County Councillor Ron Peart:

Energy from Waste

2020 stats Plymouth facility processes 65,000 tonnes of our waste each year from the South and West of the County. Overall Waste Processed 261,000 Tonnes. Electricity Generated 204,000 MWh, Steam Generated 57.000 MWh.

Plant Availability 88.93% [target] 91%

Co2 Savings 84,000 Tonnes

Landfill Diversion 99.9%

Cash Savings Vs Landfill approx. £12million pa

Plant availability below target almost entirely because of an outage in October of 100 hours due to an exploding gas bottle causing damage to the fire grate.

Plymouth is one of the least expensive in the country and Exeter one of the most expensive in the country. But both less expensive than Landfill currently £130 per ton.

Devon won an award for the Best New Idea at a recent Local Authority Re cycling Advisory Committee with our Shared Savings Scheme working in partnership with 5 of our District Councils. Over £6.8 million worth of savings have been generated over 4 years, with £3.4million shared back with East Devon, Teignbridge, Mid Devon, Torridge and North Devon. Afghan Refugees in Devon,

We now have about 150 refugees in the county temporarily housed in hotels in Exeter and Exmouth with a number of rescued cats and dogs from the well - publicised animal sanctuary in Tiverton area.
