

Season of remembering

Mark and I are settling very happily in the Rectory here in Teignmouth but we are missing our young adult children. We are missing the mess and the washing, the fact that the ham stays in the fridge for more than a couple of days and we are missing the noise – thundering feet and loud music! It has made me think about family more deeply and how we are made, formed and live in the crucible of creation called family.

Growing up I remember adoring my maternal grandfather who also thought I was wonderful. Not that he was a great huggy person but he showed me individual attention and listened to me. He let me do stuff in his garage which had carpet on the concrete floor, something I couldn't get over. When I was 8 and lived miles from him he died suddenly. My parents didn't involve me in the grieving, didn't take me to the funeral or ever visit his grave with me. It left a big hole in my heart a place of unknowing, sadness and bewilderment.

Dealing with loss is an important part of living. This time of the year is important to many people as a season of remembering - a way of honouring people who have passed. Armistice Day, of course, is an act of national remembrance for those who have died in service of our country as they have helped to preserve our way of life and freedoms.

For Christians All Souls day is a chance to honour and remember those we love but see no more who have helped to mould us as the people we are. After a death the shock can be raw and for some people that rawness will not go away as they have nightmares or live what seems a half life of sadness. Christians are taught that God's mighty power can bring joy out of grief and life out of death. God does not want us to live lives weighed down by grief or regret and through Jesus, Christians are brought to new hope and a more positive and hopeful way of living.

As you remember loved ones we warmly invite you to our services of personal remembrance on Sunday 31st October at St Johns, Bishop at 3pm and St Michaels, Teignmouth at 4.30. Let us know if you would like us to read the names of your loved ones at a service which will last 30 mins and include refreshments afterwards. There is also the Dorcas Bereavement Support Group run by Christine Marsh on 01626 772561.

Time to tidy the garden or is it?

Autumn is traditionally a time for tidying up the garden – cut back, burn, sweep up. But before you get out there with the secateurs and firelighters, spare a thought for the caterpillars, beetles and mice that need somewhere a bit warm to survive the winter. And for the birds that need to find food, especially those (like the blackbirds) that don't benefit from our feeders.

By putting off those tidying jobs until Spring, or forgetting about them altogether, we can really make a difference for nature. Seedheads of spent flowers provide food for the birds, as do berries on shrubs we might be tempted to prune. The hollow stems of angelica or hogweed are used by solitary bees to lay their eggs. Fallen leaves may be refuges for butterfy eggs or caterpillars. And if you're lucky enough to have a hedgehog anywhere near, you'll know that they need a pile of logs or leaves, or an open shed door, to find a place to hibernate.

Our top tips for this autumn are:

- ✓ Leave seedheads, hollow stems and ivy as they are cut them back in the Spring
- ✓ Wait till the birds have had the berries before you prune shrubs
- ✓ If you have woody cuttings, don't burn them make a tidy pile in a corner and it instantly becomes a habitat
- ✓ A log pile made of thicker wood is also a great habitat for insects, spiders, frogs, newts and voles (a tough decision, because the wood could also feed your wood-burner!)
- ✓ Leave the greenhouse door open, with some straw inside. It'll be a home for something!
- ✓ Fallen leaves on beds can be left as mulch beetles or caterpillars may take refuge there, providing food for birds, frogs and toads
- ✓ Where you need to sweep up leaves, make a pile rather than burning them at the least you'll have some nice leaf mould next year.
- ✓ Enjoy your new-found leisure. Put your feet up and have a cup of tea!

Teignbridge is supporting Devon County Council and NHS Devon to do everything it can to slow down the increase in infections and help protect vulnerable communities from the impact of this rise.


