

# Thoughts from Rev Elizabeth Burren

The sun is shining outside my window as I write this. It's one of those warm early autumn days that come as a gift, a little extra bit of summer that we didn't expect, and we appreciate it all the more because we know it won't last. I love the turning of the seasons, and the arrival of this autumn reminds me that it's now a full year that we have been living in Teignmouth and working in the eight churches in this area. Such a lot has happened, and it's been a joy to get to know the people and communities here. The towns are so different to the villages, and the villages are so different to each other, but what has been universal has been the warmth and generosity with which we have been welcomed and included.

At intervals through this last year, I have walked on the seafront in Teignmouth or on the cliffs above Shaldon and looked back across the bay to Exmouth where Peter and I lived for thirty years; not with regret, but with thankfulness for that phase of our life. For the highs and lows and the people that have formed us and equipped us for what we are doing now. Last week I returned to Exmouth and looked across to the Parson and Clerk, Teignmouth and the Ness. This different perspective helped me to resolve my feelings about moving on in life. The people and places that I love from my Exmouth life are part of me now, and will go with me into the future just as the relationships, challenges and joys of my life here will become a part of who I am.

What helps you to look forward, and back, and to reflect on your journey through life? Life's big events - a change of job, a house move, a bereavement, or a new birth are all natural moments to reflect; but the changing of the seasons can also prompt a more regular review of memories and future hopes.

As curates in the church Peter and I are still learning and growing as ministers, and part of our training is a requirement to reflect regularly on what we are doing, how it is going, what can we learn? It's helpful in so many ways and a habit I hope I never lose. It can be so easy to drift through life feeling as if we are making little difference, but when we look back at where we were a week, a month or a year ago we can see where God has been at work. It's the tiny things, the everyday acts of kindness that can easily go unnoticed that add up to making a difference in the world.

As the sunny days become fewer and the leaves change colour, I look ahead to all that autumn and winter will bring. Soon our churches will be full of school children and choirs rehearsing for carol services, and we will be taking festive praise and prayers into our local residential homes. With other church leaders we will sing carols in the Triangle and bless the annual switching on of lights, and in all the busy chaos of the season we will try to keep our eyes on the coming of God to us as a human child. Jesus shows us what God looks like in human skin, loving, forgiving, healing, if we can do life as much as possible like he did it, we won't be going far wrong.


# Ashcombe Harvest Supper

# **Parish Councillor Vacancy**

The Parish Council has one Councillor vacancy. If you are interested in becoming a parish councillor, please contact the Clerk — <a href="mailto:idefordclerk@hotmail.co.uk">idefordclerk@hotmail.co.uk</a> stating why you would like to be considered and confirming that you qualify:

Any person wishing to be considered to act as a Parish Councillor must be qualified to hold office. Sections 79-81 of the Local Government Act 1972 contain the relevant provisions regarding the qualification of candidates, as follows:

To qualify as a candidate and to continue to hold the office of Parish Councillor a person must be a British or Commonwealth citizen, citizen of the Republic of Ireland or a citizen of another Member State of the European Union and, on the relevant day, must have attained the age of eighteen years.

In addition, the candidate must qualify under at least one of the following conditions –

- on that day and thereafter s/he continues to be registered as a local government elector for the parish (meaning the whole area of the parish):
- during the whole of the 12 months preceding s/he has occupied as owner or tenant land or other premises in the parish.
- during the 12 months preceding their principal or only place of work has been in the parish; or
- during the whole of the 12 months preceding s/he has been resident in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it (of its parish boundary).

It is also necessary that the candidate should not be disqualified from holding the office of Parish Councillor for any reason set out in Section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972.



To note, I have a small community grant in which I would like to allocate to local community projects.

As an aside, I would like to encourage residents to report the ongoing problem with potholes to the Devon County Council website. The more people reporting, the more effective the system.

PC Clarke Orchard is moving on from his role as our Neighbourhood Beat Manager to a new role with the Rural Affairs Team.

Deadline for free trees scheme.

Landowners and communities in Devon are being reminded to apply for this year's free tree scheme.

Devon County Council is offering up to 50 free tree packs, each containing 45 native broadleaved trees and other items to support their planting and establishment.

This project will help achieve carbon net zero, tackle the Climate Emergency and support nature recovery.

Last winter, more than 17,000 trees were planted in Devon through the Emergency Tree Fund, a project run in partnership with the Woodland Land Trust, with additional support via the Forestry Commission. This breaks down to 6,750 trees awarded to landowners and more than 9,800 trees planted on County Farms Estate and other council owned land.

Applications for this year's scheme need to be completed online by Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September.

Applicants will be notified if they have been successful before the end of October and the free tree packs will be delivered in time to be planted during National Tree Week from [the 25<sup>th</sup> November – 3<sup>rd</sup> December].

# IDEFORD SUSTAINABILITY GROUP - A-Z. K is for Kitchen



Here are a few suggestions for being more sustainable in your kitchen.

- Use paper towels sparingly. Use a cloth for wiping up spills instead of reaching for the paper.
- Reduce use of Cling film maybe just try using less of it! Try Beeswax paper
  or reusable cling film (Agreena 3-in-1 wraps) to replace a whole range of
  kitchen products including foil and baking paper.
- Don't throw away plastic bags after one use. Most can be washed and re-used (but not advisable if raw meat or fish has been stored in them).
- Embrace left overs and reduce food waste.
- Opt for eco friendly cleaning products that are biodegradable and free of phosphates.
- Clean your fridge coils. Dust significantly reduces the appliances energy
  efficiency. Once a year unplug and if accessible use a vacuum or duster
  round the coils.
- Buy local food when you can.
- Try composting your peelings and raw fruit and veg. Food in landfills releases
  methane, a potent greenhouse gas. Once rotted down the compost is
  beneficial on your garden.
- Run the dishwasher only when full.
- When boiling water in a pan put a lid on it.
- When cooking a small amount use a microwave or air fryer which uses less energy than heating up a full size oven.
- Use LED Lighting and energy efficient appliances.
