



I will not be physically going on holiday this year, but I will be seeking refreshment, both mental and spiritual.

I may find this time of refreshment as I sit and look at a beautiful view of the sea, or as I sit on a bench at Teignmouth railway station watching passing trains flying past to far flung destinations.

And as I sit and reflect, my mind takes me with them to far-off places, perhaps to my favourite island in Scotland. Memories again of a happy holiday.

And as I escape to this special place, I recall the words of St Paul, telling me to focus on the things above, and perhaps in doing so I can slow my busy mind, relax, and begin to experience something of God's eternal time, so well described by Professor Brian Cox in a tv programme a few years ago, where he said these words concerning the stars in the sky.

058.4 Request to be made for school bus access during the forthcoming roadworks.

PC to request that Butts Lane be resurfaced.

Cllr A Carter-Woodwark reported that the works to repair the potholes outside of Stapley Cottage were substandard. Discussion on employing a contractor to repair potholes was deferred.

058.5 Sustainable Ideford agreed in principle to proceed with becoming a committee of the PC to benefit from governance over budget decision making, with further discussion needed at the next meeting over Terms of Reference and delegated powers. Sustainable Ideford to have a stall at the Autumn village event to promote carbon reduction schemes. The wildlife camera is being used and taking good images.

058.6 Cllr J Gardner to submit comments from Cllrs on the Devon Climate Emergency consultation with particular reference to environmental planning conditions and the Teignbridge area.

058.7 The Wildlife Wardens recently took part in the Devon Bat Survey, organised by Devon Wildlife Trust with results showing that out of the 17 bat species in the UK 13 passed through the area.

Audio equipment has kindly been loaned to encourage swifts to nest in the church tower.

Work being carried out by the Wildlife Wardens highlights the importance of the environment we live in.

#### 057/23 REPORTS:

#### Cllr Ron Peart

South West Regional & Coastal Committee: I attended this committee, one of the Improvements is Phase 1 of the Holbeam Dam, measures were signed off in April 2022 following completion of the bypass, new radial gate and control building. A site acceptance test of phase 1 works is now complete, and final works to be completed by Summer2023 along with delivery of final documentation. The Final Business Case for Phase 2 work for the delivery of a new stepped concrete spillway was approved in January 2023. A Planning application for a compensatory bat structure has been submitted to Teignbridge District Council and new access bridge application to be submitted spring 2023. A bat licence for removal of old control structure has also been gained. Phase 2 is currently programmed to be on site in summer 2023.

Reservoir stocks: Total reservoir storage increased from 71% to 76% during March, ending the month lower than at the same time in 1995 and 2022. Storage increased by 2% at Wimbleball, at 5% at Roadford, and 7% at Colliford, to net storage of 100%, 63% and 56% respectively. Devon and Cornwall received 202mm of rain during March [203% of LTA] which is classed as exceptionally high for the time of year. Ten catchments received exceptionally high rainfall. March 2023 was the 3<sup>rd</sup> wettest in a record starting 1891, the last time it was wetter was in 1947. The Teign and Torbay and the Tamar catchment were recorded as the 10<sup>th</sup> wettest 6 –month periods [October- March] in the 132-year record and the Avon, Dart and Erme catchment was recorded as the 6<sup>th</sup> wettest period in the 132 year record. Rain started falling on the 5<sup>th</sup> March and continued daily through the rest of the month across Devon and Cornwall.

#### Cllr K Gearon

Still very much in the induction stage and doing lots of training, I would like to introduce myself as part of South Devon Alliance, an independent party. I feel honoured to be voted in to represent Kingsteignton East and Ideford and am looking forward to working with you and please let me know if there is anything I can do to help.

Sitting on the TDC Licensing Committee and reserve for Planning and also Overview and Scrutiny Committees and I have applied to become a Town Cllr for Kingsteignton.

The latest Police newsletter has been posted on the website and circulated to Cllrs.

### How to help our bats - thoughts from the Wildlife Wardens

In the last issue, we reported that 13 species of bat had been detected in Ideford. This month, we give some advice on how to keep the bats flourishing here.

Some of you have suggested putting up bat boxes and they will certainly help – near a hedge and facing SE to SW is best - but bear in mind that bats need larger spaces when raising their young, as the females gather in maternity roosts. Often these are in buildings and leaving gaps at the eaves, or between lines of timber cladding, will allow the bats to get in – they won't do any harm.

Roosting space is only the beginning, though. Bats need food too! Since they feed on moths and other insects, anything we do for the latter will be good for bats too. So plant pollinator-friendly plants, such as daisies, herbs and tall, pale or night-scented flowers. Night-scented stocks, evening primrose, hemp agrimony and cow parsley are some examples.

Another way to provide food is by making a pond, with aquatic plants. The larvae of some flies need water to develop and the adult flies will become food for the bats. Bats usually set up their maternity roosts near water.

Finally, there are some things to avoid: pesticides, which may kill off the insects and deprive the bats of food, and light pollution, which confuses bats' sense of the time to emerge for hunting. If you have outside lights, fit a cover on top so that the light shines downward.

If you'd like to know more, the Wildlife Trusts have produced a great guide to bats and their needs. Enter 'Wild About Gardens - Stars of the Night guide' in your search bar.

Here's hoping we find even more bats in the Parish next year!
