

065.2 Tim Coleridge has started maintenance work on the village oak tree and surrounding land. Cllrs agreed that a good job was being done. **065.3** A complaint had been received from a resident about motorised vehicles using Muddy Bottom Bridle Path. Another resident stated that they, too, had heard the vehicles, but felt that it was not happening often enough to warrant a complaint. It was also thought that it could be legitimate users: farmers accessing fields, for example. If more complaints were received, then further action would be taken.

065.4 It was proposed by Cllr A Carter-Woodwark, seconded by Cllr D Fox and agreed by all to pursue the Road Warden Scheme from DCC Highways, which would enable the PC and any volunteers to repair pot holes themselves. DCC would insure those in the scheme and provide both funding and training.

065.5 The PC decided to submit the following response for the TDC Local Plan Consultation: Ideford Parish Council would ask developers to consider the impact any future development will have on the environment and address the need to tackle climate change issues. They also note that the plan does not include any innovative solutions to deal with traffic and transport management: in particular the need to provide better public transport. As usual, sustainability following house building is always a step behind. **065.6** It was proposed by Clir A Carter-Woodwark, seconded by Clir J Gardner and agreed by all to ask the Parish News to publish the minutes of the Parish Council meetings and to pay 100% of the extra costs incurred. **065.7** Clirs discussed the training they had received from TDC's Karen Trickey and Sarah Selway: they thought it had been interesting and informative and looked forward to the return of face-to-face training.

There will however have to be a period of time where the permanent signals are removed so that the new equipment can be installed, and during this time temporary signals will be used. We would aim to keep this period to a minimum.

Cllr T Hill reported that tarmac used on the A380 repairs was poor quality as pits were already beginning to appear. Cllr R Peart said he would inform DCC Highways.

District Councillor Beryl Austen:

Teignbridge now has a five year strategy to plant trees to help to combat climate change by removing carbon and storing oxygen back into the air. The strategy is to increase the tree canopy by at least 3per cent over the five year project focusing on land which the council owns.

Teignbridge is now back to normal meetings for full council and committees. The next Full Council meeting of the Council will be on the 20th Sept. I attend Licensing and Regulatory meetings which deal with taxi licenses, tree preservation orders and licensed premises, and have been to several training sessions as we return to normal, as over the past year there have been changes, especially to planning.

A committee meeting of the council on 13th July will be looking at jobs and the economy of Teignbridge and how best to re-engage our district and return to pre-pandemic times and even improve on those economic situations.

PC Clarke Orchard – Neighbourhood Beat Manager and PCSO Saul Bunce: read by the Clerk.

Apologies, for the lack of information last month, however as you are all aware we were heavily committed with the 'G7' Summit.

Moving forward, I have compiled a monthly newsletter/gazette that is packed with 38 pages of very useful information, guidance on reporting, signposting to partner agencies, monthly themes etc, etc... Finally, could we please start looking at suitable dates for PACT meetings. I am proposing we make attempts to resume again in August 2021. Both Saul and I, would like to assign a couple hours at the designated venue/meeting place and then remain within the community after that simply to engage with the community and show a presence. As you are all aware, we made considerable strides with getting PACT meetings up and running again prior to the restrictions imposed by COVID-19.

065/21 PARISH MATTERS

065.1 Dominic Morby and Robin Aaronson were welcomed as the new wildlife wardens for the parish. Robin indicated that this was a fluid role and they would be inviting feedback from residents, particularly focusing on care for the hedgerows, and monitoring wildlife. ACT will provide training at no charge. Future projects in the parish may need funding and the PC all agreed to support these projects.

060/21 WELCOME AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The Chairman opened the meeting at 7:06pm. No apologies were received. The Chairman reminded all present to sign in or use the app to check in.

061/21 MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

It was proposed by Cllr A Carter-Woodwark, seconded by Cllr T Hill, and agreed by all to accept the minutes of the meeting of Thursday 10th June 2021 as a true and accurate record.

062/21 DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

None

063/41 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

A resident asked why they were being told to remove their caravan when there was a need for affordable housing in the area and they felt this provided for that need. The resident was told that the caravan was unlawful and TDC were now dealing with the matter.

The same resident asked for an apology from the PC for stopping the work they were carrying out on the footpath next to their land. The resident was told that permission was needed for work to be carried out on a public footpath.

A full report re the footpath was given online and minuted at the meeting of April 8th. Both matters are in the hands of enforcement at Teignbridge and nothing will be gained in discussing the subject further at this time. Residents voiced their agreement to publishing the PC minutes in the Parish News (item 065.6).

064/21 REPORTS

County Councillor Ron Peart:

Traffic signal replacement works, Exeter Road / Ley Lane Junction, Kingsteignton. On an annual basis we undertake replacement schemes at traffic signal sites throughout the county with the aim of replacing sites that are beyond their design life (15 years), in poor condition with often limited scope for maintenance due to availability of spares etc. This year (amongst others) we are preparing a scheme to replace the signals at the above junction. The intended works involve the replacement of all equipment and any changes necessary to the ducting required to achieve this. The new equipment will be modern LED Extra Low Voltage equipment as is now standard, which brings improvements from both power consumption and safety points of view. The work is programmed to take place towards the end of the year. Where possible we aim to undertake as much of the civils works as possible with the existing permanent signals in place in order to have minimum effect on pedestrian and traffic, and some works may have to be completed in the evening as appropriate.

WHY SHOULD I BECOME A COUNCILLOR?

Do you care about your community?

Do you believe in strong representation?

Do you want to become involved in shaping the future of your community and the wider Parish?

AMONG other Parishes, Teignbridge and Devon County we have forged good communications and are known for our determination, fairness, transparency and over-riding politeness when dealing with a variety of issues. It has taken years of building relationships to achieve our present status.

EXPECTATIONS

- To attend Parish Council on the second Thursday of each month, except
 January and August, when there are no meetings, unless an issue arises that
 needs prompt attention e.g. planning.
- To represent Parishioners who may have an issue that the Council can give advice on or help with.
- To gain a wider knowledge of your Parish.
- · To take a full part in all discussions.

YOU CAN......be co-opted onto the Council at the present time with no need for an election. How much time you spend on your duties is largely up to you. As with most things in life, what you get back will depend on how much you put in.

ELIGIBILITY Any person wishing to be considered to act as a Parish Councillor must be qualified to hold office. Sections 79-81 of the Local Government Act 1972 contain the relevant provisions regarding the qualification of candidates, as follows:

To qualify as a candidate and to continue to hold the office of Parish Councillor a person must be a British or Commonwealth citizen, citizen of the Republic of Ireland or a citizen of another Member State of the European Union and, on the relevant day, must have attained the age of eighteen years.

In addition, the candidate must qualify under at least one of the following conditions:

- on that day and thereafter s/he continues to be registered as a local government elector for the parish (meaning the whole area of the parish);
- during the whole of the 12 months preceding s/he has occupied as owner or tenant land or other premises in the parish;
- during the 12 months preceding their principal or only place of work has been in the parish; or
- during the whole of the 12 months preceding s/he has been resident in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it (of its parish boundary).

Ann Rigby - Jones (1930 - 1921)

Ann, who was born in Ormskirk and brought up in Lancashire and Ireland, died peacefully at the age of 91 at Southlands care home in Newton Abbot on 4th August. Before moving there in 2018 she had lived in Ideford for 50 years. She arrived in the village in 1968, when she was still working at Exeter University, and lived first at Ty Gwyn (the Welsh for 'white house'), the house that her brother Peter had designed for her, and then at Town Farm Court.



Ann gave up work in 1972, after the tragic death of her brother Michael in the Staines air disaster, to become companion and carer to her mother, who suffered a stroke and moved from Ireland to live with her at Ty Gwyn until her death in 1983.

Ann had many friends in the village and played an active role in parish life as, among other things, churchwarden, parish councillor, organist, bell ringer, and organiser of coffee mornings. Perhaps her lasting legacy is the role that she played in the £40,000 project to restore the church bells, which were dedicated by the Bishop of Exeter at the beginning of 1989. The tenor bell, which had originally been cast in 1666, was re-tuned and the five smaller bells, from 1884, were melted down and re-cast at London's historic but now sadly defunct Whitechapel Bell Foundry. As secretary of the Ideford Bell Trust Ann was the driving force behind the project and paid for the treble bell herself, which she had inscribed and dedicated in memory of her parents.

Ann was later heavily involved for several years as secretary and vice-president of TED, the pioneering Thyroid Eye Disease charity founded by her great friend, Sally Mitchell.

Ann lived a busy, fulfilling, and Christian life. She always said that she would just keep on going until she either keeled over or was struck by lightning. Many of her friends and family thought the same. Sadly it was not to be. Fortunately she found a safe haven at Southlands where she was looked after wonderfully for three years, latterly in the most testing of times. For all those who knew her the world was a richer place for Ann having been here and is a poorer place for her having gone.

Ann was a very dear friend to so many people in Ideford. I was so sad that she wasn't able to live out her days at Town Farm Court where she was incredibly happy after her many years living at Ty Gwyn. Her move to Southlands in Newton Abbot was a success, but she never really left Ideford. Any visit to Ann began with an interrogation of what was happening in the village.

Ann was one of life's organisers and mobilisers who truly involved herself in many aspects of village life and encouraged others to do so too. She understood that to have a vibrant community everyone had to play a part and she led by example.

Ann's ability to not hold back, and say exactly what she was thinking is legendary. Although pretty IT savvy her lack of understanding of how Facebook operates led to some incendiary posts, but her response was always "well, that's what I think"!

Involvement in the Church was central to Ann's life, whether that was the day to day running, playing the organ (if Ann was on duty the hymns were played at a supercharged speed) or her devotion to bells. Her generosity in ensuring the completion of the restoration of the Ideford bells has enabled many local and visiting ringers to enjoy our wonderful tower.

Jams, jellies, pickles and lemon curd. Fundraising necessities and Ann's forte. She was also queen of the coffee mornings, her annual MacMillan fundraiser was a must.

Good Company singers was Ann's baby. They spent rehearsals fuelled by red wine but had much success at local festivals and at fundraising concerts.

Perhaps her biggest love was for her feline friends. Lanto and Gwennie were the last in a long line of companions. Ann was heart broken when she had to leave Gwennie behind.

In the early 1950's Ann, needing a period of recuperation from an illness, set out to visit a friend now living in India. It was a real POSH boat voyage. Port out, starboard home. Post Raj, India hadn't changed that much for the British. There were lots of social events and many eligible young men working many miles from home. Absolutely not Ann's dream scenario. "Liz, I never met anyone I couldn't live without "

Thank you to Liz Spencer for representing the village with this tribute. We all have our own memories of Ann, and I am sure they will be shared at village events for years to come.

Ideford joins Wildlife Warden scheme



Most of us in the village are fond of wildlife and want to do our best to help nature flourish. It is for this reason that Ideford has now joined the **Wildlife Warden** scheme set up by **Action on Climate in Teignbridge (ACT).**

ACT was created in 2019 to help residents and councils build climate-friendly communities, with increased and thriving wildlife. It aims to train Wildlife Wardens in every parish to work with their communities to make each parish a better home for nature. So far 34 of the 50 Teignbridge parishes have Wardens and two Ideford residents, Dominic Morby and Robin Aaronson, have now agreed to take on the role. There is no limit on the number of Wardens, so we'd be delighted if anyone else wants to join us, across the age range.

Some of the things that Wardens in other parishes have done are:

- providing advice on wildlife-friendly gardening (eg pollinator plants, ponds, alternatives to insecticides)
- surveying the parish to see what wildlife is present, which habitats are in good condition and which might be improved (this could be as simple as encouraging people to do the Big Garden Birdwatch or Big Butterfly Count, or maybe a hedgehog survey)
- adopting a roadside verge, through Devon County Council, and managing it for wildflowers
- assessing planning applications for their effect on wildlife, proposing mitigation measures and checking that they are put into effect.

We will work closely with the Parish Council and we want to emphasise that this is not about telling owners of land or gardens what to do. The Wardens aim to be a catalyst for projects that people want to do anyway. We expect Ideford residents to approach us – not the other way round!

It has been a deep sadness to hear of Ann's death. Some while ago I spoke to her on the phone at her care home. My condolences to her family and friends.

When I first moved to Ideford as Rector and also of Ashcombe and Luton (along with being domestic Chaplain to the then Bishop of Exeter), one of the happiest periods of my working life began. This was in large part due to the kind welcome from the villagers and the variety of skills and initiative they possessed. Ann was among the foremost in her support of the Church, not only Ideford, but also at Ashcombe where she regularly played the organ.

I recall one wintry Sunday when the roads were blocked with snow. Ann and I trudged on foot up to Ashcombe where a small but determined congregation joined us.

It was all too easy to delegate secretarial tasks to Ann who would execute them impeccably. I daresay there was never proportional gratitude for this significant voluntary resource.

She will be most remembered for her campaigning, fund raising and her determination towards getting the Ideford church bells restored. Her leadership was charming and persuasive but was also formidable. It was a long and arduous journey which she travelled with persistence and good grace. She deserves to be remembered gratefully and respectfully throughout the future history of the village and the parish.

Requiescat in pac(h)e - but not so pac(h)e that the sound of welcoming bells is unheard!
