Winter Motoring

With the weather turning cold, check your vehicle over to make sure it is fit for the winter weather.

Are the tyres inflated to the correct pressure, and above the legal minimum depth. If you are about to start a journey and it's been snowing remove as much snow as you can from the roof, windows, and bonnet of the vehicle before driving away.

Check your oil, water, screen-wash and check your lights are in good working order prior to your journey.

If you are travelling long distance make sure you have a shovel in the boot extra warm clothing or blankets hot drink and snacks, tell someone what route you are taking and you take your mobile phone and it is fully charged.
